## SPORTS PREMIUM REPORT 2015-2016



What is the Sports Premium? The government are providing funding to primary schools to improve sports provision. Each school receives £8,000 and an extra £5 per pupil. The funding can only be spent on sports and PE in schools.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- new or additional Change4Life sport clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games

- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs.

At Snainton CE Primary we aim to use our Sports Premium budget to make the maximum impact on children's achievement in Physical Education and School Sport in the following ways

- Provide children with a wide range of Physical Education opportunities
- Take part in both competitive and cooperative PE activities
- Train a teacher to teach lessons, provide children with a wider range of opportunities and develop staff in the teaching of PE so that it becomes highly effective
- Provide high quality resources
- Assess pupil progress to ensure that high quality teaching is having an impact on improvement. To do this teachers and pupils work together to produce a PE Passport which provides a good picture of strengths and areas for improvement. Teachers also assess and make judgements during lessons and report to parents once a year.
- Provide opportunities for all pupils take part in competitive and cooperative activities in lessons, at lunchtime, after school, with cluster schools and within the Scarborough Sports Partnership
- Provide high quality teaching in swimming with a qualified instructor and lifeguard enabling all children to swim 25m by the end of Year 6. This takes place in the Summer Term at Braeburn School Pool.
- Have access to a high quality PE curriculum and to be challenged through the effective use of assessment and targets
