

STONE AGE TO IRON AGE

This half term Key Stage 2 have the topic of Stone Age to Iron Age, which covers a period of about 800,000 years! Below is a brief overview of some of the areas we will cover in class 3.

Literacy	Literacy will be based around a book called 'Wolf Brother' written by Michelle Paver. Children will be asked to read sections of this book as homework as well as in class. We will use the book for writing personal reading journals, diary extracts as well as writing out own chapters for the story.
Topic	Together with class 2, we will take a thorough look at life in Stone Age Britain. We will find out what Britain looked like and how it has changed over time. We will discover how stone age people lived, hunted and cooked, as well as finding out about how their houses and settlements were constructed.
Science	Our science subject looks at Evolution and inheritance this half term. We will start by looking at fossils and the work of Mary Anning. By finding out about how animals have changed over time to suit their environment we will be able to explain how evolution has helped animals, including humans, to survive in the modern environment.
Design Technology	Using Wolf Brother as inspiration, the children will design, cut and stitch their own stone age survival pouch to ensure they remain alive for our Stone Age Day at Danby after half term.
Art	We will be looking at cave paintings and using charcoal and other natural materials to produce range of stone age inspired art work this half term.
ICT	During this half-term, class 3 will begin finding out about coding and how computer programmes work. They will become computer programmers and design, code, test and debug their own computer games.
