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# Children's University

Children's University is organised by the University of Hull, Scarborough Campus. It is an excellent opportunity for all children in Key Stage 2 to engage with learning opportunities in the local area. Learning hours can be collected for a wide range of activities with many of them being completely free. Year 3 children will have received their packs this week and can sign up to receive their personal learning passport. If any other children in Key Stage 2 would like a new application form, please contact the school office. If children are already registered, there is no need to complete a new application.

## Parent consultations

In the last newsletter I asked for your feedback on 2 proposals following parental feedback in your questionnaires in July. One was a proposal for an extension to wrap around care to include an after school club. The second was a proposal for a full day offer in nursery at least once per week.

Your feedback suggests that there is currently no demand for an after school club. If this is suggested in the future, school will consider this again at that time.

There is some demand for a full day in nursery. Currently, the school bursar is completing a cost analysis of this proposal to enable governors to make an informed decision on any potential changes. School will update you again once a decision can be agreed.

## Water bottles

Children and staff have noticed that we are producing a large amount of plastic waste with the current arrangements for bottled water in school. Therefore, from Monday, your child may bring a water container from home to be placed at their individual work place in class. This can be re-filled in school and cleaned as part of the regular sanitising procedures in place already in school.

#### Attendance matters

Overall attendance this academic year is 96.48%. However, with absence due to self-isolation removed from this figure, our overall attendance for the whole school is 99.1%. Well done to everyone as this is outstanding.

We have more than 15 of our pupils that have maintained 100% attendance this academic year – congratulations to each of you.

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
